SECTION 2: TERMS OF REFERENCE

1. Background

- 1.1 MEGA was established in terms of the MEGA Act 1 of 2010 as an amalgamation of the previous MEGA, the Mpumalanga Agricultural Development Corporation and the Mpumalanga Housing Finance Company.
- 1.2 MEGA is Mpumalanga's development finance institution whose primary role is to foster the growth and development of the provincial economy in order to help reduce unemployment, poverty and inequality.
- 1.3 MEGA supports economic development by investing in the development of Infrastructure, SMMEs, Property, Agriculture, Housing and Trade & investment Promotion.
- 1.4 MEGA partners with local and international investors and communities to secure tangible investment in the province.

2. Purpose of Tender

- 2.1 The purpose of this project is to conduct developmental impact assessment as part of the monitoring and evaluation function of Corporate Strategy Unit
- **2.2** The focus of the developmental impact assessment for the 2025/26 financial year will focus on the housing loan activities within the funding division, specifically on the following:
 - Sentiments from the home loan clients that were assisted by MEGA.
 - Number of homeowners that benefitted from financial and non-financial services offered by the entity.
 - Adherence to MEGA's housing mandate in terms of its Act.
 - Positive impact derived through MEGAs housing loans financing activities.
 - Need for added services that may be offered to existing home loan clients.
 - Effectiveness of the non-financial support provided to home loan clients.
- 2.3 The exercise will measure developmental impact derived through home loan financing in order to guide the service efforts of the organization.

3. Key Deliverables / Scope

3.1 Methodology

The project will be executed based on the following:

- Determining the number of homeowners that benefitted from financial and nonfinancial services offered by the entity.
- Determine locations of the houses associated with a financed bond to assess if MEGAs mandate is correctly executed to ensure inclusiveness to the 'housing market gap' clients and those residing in townships.
- Determining the number of people per household that resides on MEGAs funded homes to assess the impact derived from such financial support provided.
- Determine a need for any further assistance or added benefits / products that may be required by the home loan clients.
- Assess the types of non-financial support provided to home loan clients.

A formal Service Level Agreement (SLA) will be entered into with the appointed service provider, outlining the scope, deliverables, timelines, and obligations associated with the project.

These Terms of Reference (ToR) serve as a framework for the evaluation and appointment process, ensuring alignment between MEGA's project requirements and the technical capacity, experience, and qualifications of the service provider.

The proposal submitted in response to this RFQ will form the basis of the SLA to be concluded between MEGA and the successful bidder.

4. Roles & Responsibilities

- **4.1** The Head: Corporate Strategy is the project lead.
- **4.2** The service provider will work with the project lead throughout the project implementation.
- **4.3** Deliverables of the project and project sign off will be done by the project lead.

5. Evaluation Criteria

Evaluation will be carried out on the Functionality and the Preferential Point System (Specific goals and Price) as the *Preferential Procurement regulations*, 2022.

5.1 Value of Bid

The value of this bid is estimated not to exceed R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).

Privacy, Confidentiality and Data Protection

- 1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.
- 1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. **DEFINITIONS**

- (a) "tender" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) "price" means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) "tender for income-generating contracts" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) "the Act" means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
