2. BACKGROUND AND INVITATION

Nkomazi Special Economic Zone (Nkomazi SEZ) is a State-Owned Company (SOC) Business Reg No: Nkomazi SEZ SOC LTD CIPC 2014/449561/30 established in terms of the SEZ Act to develop, manage and operate the Nkomazi SEZ. The Nkomazi Special Economic Zone (SEZ) represents a strategically positioned logistics and industrial platform within South Africa, located along one of the most critical trade corridors in the Southern African region. Its proximity to the Lebombo border and the Maputo Corridor places it at the centre of regional trade flows between South Africa, Mozambique, Eswatini and the broader Southern African Development Community (SADC). The site is located on the southern side of the N4 Highway opposite Komati Poort Town. The area is located between contours 185 and 145 above mean sea level and the average annual rainfall is 427mm. The terrain is undulating with relative moderate to steep gradients. The Ngweti River bisects the site in a roughly east-west direction.

This calls for a suitably qualified and experienced Professional Construction Health and Safety Agent to submit a comprehensive quotation for the provision of health and safety consulting services registered as PrCHSA for the construction of External Electrical Bulk Infrastructure for Phase 1 at Nkomazi Special Economic Zone (NSEZ) situated at Komati Poort, Mpumalanga Province. This call is informed by the requirements to the Legislations promulgated under the Occupational Health and Safety Act and Regulations, Act (85 of 1993), National Disaster Management Act, Act (57 of 2002), Compensation for Occupational injuries and Diseases Act, Act (130 of 1993) and relevant legislations. This seeks to ensure that the health and safety measures are taken by employers consistently with the overall strategies and policies to minimize the risks exposure. Considering the above-mentioned, a request for quotation from the appointed and experienced PrCHSA is required to consider full management approach throughout the project management stages to ensure that all intended work is performed safely, without risks to people in the workplace. The respondents are ideally required to be based within reasonable proximity to the project site or to demonstrate an established operational footprint within the area and surrounding municipalities within the Mpumalanga Province, to minimize undue disbursement and enhance project efficiency.

3. PROJECT LOCATION

The construction works is to be undertaken at Nkomazi Special Economic Zone (NSEZ) situated in the Komatipoort Townlands on portion 58 Farm, South Africa, Mpumalanga.

4. SCOPE OF WORK

The specific services to be provided by the registered PrCHSA shall include the duty to take full responsibility for managing and supervising all health and safety activities during planning, production and close-out stages. The successful service provider will be expected to sign an appointment letter in terms of sub regulation 5(5) of the Construction Regulations 2014 and form of acceptance in writing. The successful PrCHSA will form part of the Professional Team on the project; submit invoices and statements to the **client** for verification and payment purposes assigned by the SHE Project Manager. The Construction Health & Safety Agent's scope of works will constitute the main electrical activities in relation to the existing and future electrical infrastructure at the Nkomazi SEZ but not limited –

- External Bulk Electrical Infrastructure Construction
- Internal Bulk Electrical Infrastructure Construction

4.1 Project scope of work

The general scope of the works entails the full scope of construction work relating to the **Construction of the bulk electrical infrastructure**, as applicable to the NSEZ responsibilities. The Construction scope of work included under the Contract typically encompasses electrical aspects including but not limited to the following:

- construction of extensive lengths of high voltage lines (HV Lines)
- construction of electrical substations
- electrical installations
- use of plants/equipment/tools

5. KEY DELIVERABLES AND CONTRACTUAL DUTIES (aligned with SACPCMP criteria)

Respondents must be actively registered with the South African Council of Construction and Project Management Professions (SACPCMP) as a Professional Construction Health and Safety Agent. The respondents are required to have relevant experience and knowledge to undertake the duties of managing, planning, organising, leading and controlling the health and safety on an Infrastructure project. The NSEZ requests a capable and competent Professional Construction Health and Safety Agent to submit Quotation for the provision of professional consulting services for this project.

The services to be provided by the Service Provider will include the following but not limited to:

- Attend Client Progress Meetings and other ad-hoc meetings;
- Attend planning, tender briefing, site handover, technical and progress meetings;
- Identify and develop an appropriate Safety and Health (SHE) legal framework for a construction project;
- Review project surveys, tests, investigations and identify permits required on the project;
- Ensure appointment of Project Team member/role in terms of the Construction Regulations 2014;
- Prepare Project Baseline Risk Assessment.
- Prepare Project SHE Site Specification

- Prepare itemised SHE aspects captured into the Project's Bill of Quantities to make provision for the cost of SHE Compliance and control measures;
- Evaluate and verify the Contractors' health and safety competencies;
- Assess and approve Contractors' health and safety Plans;
- Conduct audits and inspection to ensure the project is being implemented in compliant with the Project's health and safety Specification and the Principal Contractor' approved health and safety Plan;
- Stop any contractor from executing construction work, which is not in accordance with the project's health and safety Specification and the Principal Contractor' approved health and safety Plan, of which poses a threat to the health and safety of persons;
- Issue penalties where there are repetitive non-conformances
- Revise health and safety risk profile and specification in response to scope of work changes;
- Facilitate management of incident and accident occurrence and investigations;
- Advise and facilitate health and safety system plans reviews for continual improvement;
- Facilitate compilation of consolidated health and safety File and approvals for construction works application to the Department; and
- Facilitate compilation of project SHE closeout file.

6. RFQ PROCESS

Invited service providers from the updated SACPCMP database should be allowed to submit quotations.. Database can be sourced from SACPCMP website. Candidate Registration will be not be consider.

To promote cost-effectiveness, efficient contract administration and timely response to project requirements, preference may be afforded to suitably qualified service providers with an established operational presence or demonstrated project experience within the Mpumalanga Province and neighbouring provinces, provided that such preference is applied in accordance with the applicable procurement policies and legislation.

7. EVALUATIONS OF QUOTATIONS

For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
- (a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system; or
 - (b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system,
